Welcome to Our Association of Remedy (OAR), a social welfare organization, registered under West Bengal Society Registration Act in 2012 having Income Tax exemption u/s 80-G and 12-A approval. Work on education to the slum children, economically backward community nutrition project and education development project. We also work on environment and health projects. OAR runs a non-formal school at Majerhat Railway Station area in South Kolkata, where 102 nos. slum children get basic education. OAR runs a training centre at Joka, where OAR imparts skill training (Beautician Course, Sewing etc.) with free basis to the economically backward women. OAR owns a Community Duck Farm for economic benefit of local people. OAR organizes Health Check-up Camp, Blood Donation Camp, Eye Tests Camp, at regular interval during whole round the year.

Brief of the activities in the year 2021-2022

EDUCATION& CHILDCARE PROGRAMME

> MUKTI:Care for the slum children:

MUKTI is a welfare initiative comprehended by OAR. In India, around 170 million or 40 percent of children are suffering from vulnerable situation and experiencing difficult circumstances. Focusing on the target group, OAR has been executing MUKTI program to improve the status of the targeting beneficiaries.

MUKTI is a protection for children in need of Majerhat (Near the railway station), Taratala, West Bengal. Currently 204 children are being benefited from this program. Under this program, all learning materials, school bags, uniforms and food items are provided at free of cost to all the children enrolled with the school.





> CHANDERHAT: Art & Craft Workshop:

Learning trough entertainment is the focus of the programme named 'Chander Hat'- is an initiative for skill development of slum and street children year-round. This programme covers all round cultural activities including sports, theatre, short film projection, dance performance and talent hunt of children enrolled under the project named "Chanderhat".





SUNDARBAN SISHU BIKASH KENDRA: A Early child care and learning centre for tribal children:

Since inception in the year of 2022SundarbanSishuBikash Kendra currently running with 40 Nos of Tribal Children's, where a early stage of care and learning supports provided throughout the year with the help and association of Jindal Stainless foundation and West Bengal forest department. OAR has arranged to provide basic and complementary grooming skills to thesabar tribal children's residing at G Plot, Patharpratima Block, Satyadaspur, South 24 Parganas. OAR has deputed 4 numbers of Teacher, 2 numbers of Co-coordinator and 1 village animator to run this centre from Monday to Saturday every week.





LIVELIHOOD DEVELOPMET PROGRAMME

> Skill Development Programme for women Convergence with Forest Department (Government of West Bengal)

Our Association of Remedy was collaborating with Forest department (Government of West Bengal) towards implementing a skill development project on Kitchen Garden training programme and Duck Farming. Kitchen gardening, crab farming training programme for the beneficiaries of Sundarbans regions. Sundarbans is the largest mangrove forest in the world and a UNESCO world heritage. But the area is populated by some of the world's poorest people characterized by low levels of socio-economic in dictators. In this context Kitchen Garden Duck Farming and Crab farming Training Project were the revolutionary steps for livelihood generation.

The main focus of the training programme was capacity building of rural women in the Kitchen Garden and Duck Farming and Crab farming respectively 50 trainees from each trade were selected from the Block of Patharpratima, of South 24 Parganas district.



1. Capacity building training for poor women: The main focus of the training programme was capacity building of rural women in the Kitchen Garden and Duck Farming and respectively 50 trainees from each trade were selected from the Block of Patharpratima, of South 24 Parganas district.

Duration of the Training: 3 Days.

<u>Location of the Centre:</u> Community Sheleter of Forest Department, Satyadaspur.

<u>Trained By:</u> Dr. Santanu Bera, Assistant Professor of Bengal Veterinary College Research and Development.





2. Capacity building training for poor crab farmer: The main focus of the training programme was capacity building of rural crab farmer in the crab Farming and respectively 25 trainees were selected from the Block of Patharpratima, of South 24 Parganas district.

<u>Trained By:</u>Dr. Santanu Bera, Assistant Professor of Bengal Veterinary College Research and Development.

3. Capacity building training for poor JFMC Members: The

main focus of the training programme was capacity building of rural JFMC women members in the Goat Farming and respectively 50 trainees were selected from the Block of Patharpratima, of South 24 Parganas district.

<u>Trained By:</u> Dr. Santanu Bera, Assistant Professor of Bengal Veterinary College Research and Development.

4. Dipshika- A skill development project for women:

This programme named "Dipshikha" is inclusive of Campbell Duck distribution and Tailoring Project. Under this project, two-fold training programme is imparted consisting of six month's basic training course and one year's advanced course is divided into two groups of women containing ten women in each group. Total number of beneficiaries under this project wasone sixty (160) during the accounting year 2021-22. Total number of ducks distributed among the beneficiaries during the same period wasfifteen (15) per trainee.

SELF-HELP PROGRAMME

> CAMPBELL DUCK FARMING CUM TRAINING PROGRAMME:

This programme was initially launched in collaboration with Sarala Welfare Trust having its registered office located at Andul, Howrah-711304and since October, 2019

has been continued out of owned fund.

Under this programme, training facilities for duck farming is provided for the benefit of women of low-income group. If any income is earned from the sale of products likeduck dropping fertilizer, egg and meat is utilized to meet the cost of training programme as aforesaid as well as to support the education of streetchildren

The project is located nearby Thakurpur area by acquisition of three bigha pond. Maintenance and supervisory services for three hundred ducks are h



supervisory services for three hundred ducks are hired by our society.

HEALTHCARE PROGRAMME

BLOOD DONATION CAMP:

One day blood donation camp jointly with khanik milon club (Sarsuna, Kolkata-61) and Kothari Medical blood bank organized on 15/08/2021 near sarsuna 7A Bus Stand, kolkata-700 061 and total 168 donor was participated on this programme. Donors are rewarded with tree plants.





ECO ENVIRONMENT CREATION PROGRAMME

> TREE PLANTATION PROGRAMME:

Through this programme, trees are planted that provide Shadeand also feed people with fruits as well as helps to prevent environmental pollution. Two hundred (500) fruit trees, Six Thousand (7000) Neem Trees have been seeded along the road side of James Long Sarani, Diamond Harbour Road and Yeni Sarani at Joka in Kolkata in the month of July , 2021.



> ORGANIC FARMING PROGRAMME:

Careful handling of fertilizer and insect repellents as well as alternative soil treatment methods, are important to ensure that human health is not jeopardized. This programme has been launched to convince farmers to use compost as a fertilizer rather than a chemical compound during the course of production of vegetables, fruits and herbs. The project is being run at Green Park in the area of Joka, Kolkata.



DISASTER MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

COVID-19:

The Covid-19 Pandemic is one of the worst health and economic crisis in modern history and its continuous to require the best of humanity to overcome. During the post lockdown period OAR was involved in the distribution of food grains to the people worst affected at Majherhat, Kolkata W.B. slum area. Jindal Stainless Foundation made an indigenous support for the 400 beneficiaries of OAR[Dry ration, basic pulses, spices and hygienic products are distributed].





YAAS RELIEF WORK :-

Sundarbans, the part of West Bengal has been divested by the cyclone "Yaas" which hit the coast of India on 23rd to 28th may, 2022. One of the most severe storms hits the eastern coast of India in the past several decades. Sundarbans and its adjoining villages

and towns in South Bengal are ruined due to yaas. In such disastrous situation Our Association of Remedy along with few civil society organization and corporates came forward to support the community of the region who were already in distress situation due to lose of income for Covid-19 related lockdown. Relief work was done in joint collaboration with AICURD at Sundarban, patharpratima on 30th may , 2022 and 200 beneficiaries were supported [Dry ration, others household essentials daily needs, cloths for men & women, food for children].Our Association of Remedy came forward for the support of 400 yaas victims of Sundarbans.
